In order to help Robin, you have to answer a few riddles and collect all the clues. All the clues will help you find the final keyword to the resting place and statue of the knight Guillemain... Are you ready? Let's go then!

Take a pen and a map to find your way in the city.

1 From "place du Clocher", have a look at the village. In the Middle Ages, Saint-Émilion was a vibrant trading town surrounded by city walls and vineyards. Nowadays, this heritage is protected! This is why we need to take good care of it. This symbol, represented on the bell tower, certifies this protection.

One letter is missing! Find the symbol of protection on the bell tower and write the missing letter below:



2 Then, look behind you and observe the windows on the façade of the Tourist Office. The character represented on it is probably the patron of the village. Try to find his name, it's easy:

Look carefully at the animals carved on the wooden frieze and circle the intruder.






These monstrous beasts were represented on facades to protect houses by repelling evil, a little like gargoyles on churches!




Now, use all the clues you have gathered to find the password and reach your final destination.

Take a pen and a map find your way around the city. Are you ready? Let's go!



Help local detective Robin find all the clues! They will help you find the final keyword that will lead you to Émilion, patron saint of the town.

Go to "place du clocher" and enjoy the view over the village. The bell tower is a landmark to locate the village. Can you guess its height?




Knowing that 3 steps equal 1 meter, and that there are 192 steps, the staircase is 6 4 m high.

2 Turn around to face the former monastery refectory, nowadays the Tourist Office. Find a symbol made up of 3 letters carved in the stone above the cloister's gate.

This church, carved into the limestone in the early 12th century, was ordered by a powerful lord of the region who gave his name to a town, a battle, and a wine area near Saint-Émilion. Use the list of Libourne wine areas to guess his name:
